Crosby High School will be offering high school credit for **Communication Applications** (½ credit), **Physical Education** (½ credit), **Spanish 2** (1 credit), and **Art 1** (1 credit) courses for entering 9th graders and current Crosby High School students.

Classes will be held June 7th thru 30th, Monday thru Friday, from 7:30am - 12:30pm

Students may begin registering on April 1st.

The final deadline for registration will be June 4, 2010 before 11am.

Classes will be held at the **Crosby High School Campus.**

There will be two sessions – 7:30-10am and 10am-12:30pm

With a shortened schedule, attendance is a priority. Students can **only be allowed to miss one day** of instruction to receive credit. If a student fails to receive credit for any reason, a refund will not be granted.

The cost will be \$100 per ½ credit course. Payment may be made in **cash, cashier's check, or money order** made payable to Crosby ISD. **No Personal Checks will be accepted.**

Summer School Attendance, Discipline, and Dress Code Policies

Students accumulating more than one absence, due to absence from school, tardies, or loss of class time from disciplinary actions, etc. will be dropped from the course and will receive an F for the course, **no refunds will be given.**

Students missing partial days will be docked for half the class and absences will accumulate. Any students leaving campus must check-out through the office or be docked for a full day's absence

Standard of Conduct

Theft, vandalism, use and/or possession of tobacco, fireworks, or illegal objects, fighting, disruptions, insubordination, etc. will result in the immediate dismissal from Summer School with a grade of F and no refund.

Dress & Grooming

It is the student and parent's responsibility to comply with school rules and regulations concerning dress and appropriate grooming standards. Any form of dress that attracts undue attention, is unsafe, disrupts school, or detracts from the learning process is not acceptable. The administration and faculty will have the right to appraise any current fashion and determine whether it is appropriate or inappropriate for school wear.

1. **The primary goal:** Students must dress neatly and modestly.
2. **Hair:** The hair must be neat, clean, and well groomed. No type of head covering, cap or hat is to be worn. ***NOTE: Distraction will be defined by the principal.
3. **Dresses/Skirts:** Skirts must reach below mid-thigh when arms are at full extension down by one's side. Slits in dresses/skirts must conform to the mid-thigh rule. When seated, skirts must remain at mid-thigh. Garments should not fit tightly. Sleeveless dresses, blouses, or tops are not allowed (this includes spaghetti straps and tank tops even if covered by another garment). No pajamas or sleepwear allowed.
4. **Pants:** Slacks and jeans are appropriate. Slits/cuts or fringed openings are not permitted, even with garments underneath. Pants must be worn at the proper waist. Excessively baggy pants that prohibit students from moving in a regular manner or that require the student to hold their pants up will not be permitted. Athletic suits with pockets are permitted. Pants should not be form-fitting (i.e. tights). Form-fitting pants are considered hosiery and must be covered by a skirt, shorts, or dress of the appropriate length.
5. **Shorts:** Shorts must reach below mid-thigh when hands and arms are at full extension along one's sides. Walking shorts or dress shorts are advisable. Wind shorts, boxer shorts or biker shorts/tights are not allowed.
6. **Shirts:** Shirts should be buttoned except for the neck button or zipped to the same appropriate height. Length must be so that no torso skin is visible. Tank tops, muscle shirts, or cut-off shirts are not permitted even covered by another garment. All blouses, shirts, or tops must have sleeves. Sheer or see-through type blouses may not be worn. There should be no holes in shirts and any opening should not reveal private parts of one's body or undergarment. Off the shoulder shirts are not permitted. Shirts with references to violence, drugs, gangs, obscene gestures, lewd suggestions, etc. will not be permitted.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STUDENT TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH DRESS CODE REGULATIONS. FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN DISCIPLINARY ACTION. PERSISTANT DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS WILL RESULT IN THE APPROPRIATE DISCIPLINARY ACTION FOR REFUSAL TO COMPLY WITH SCHOOL POLICIES AND DISTRUPTION OF THE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT.
